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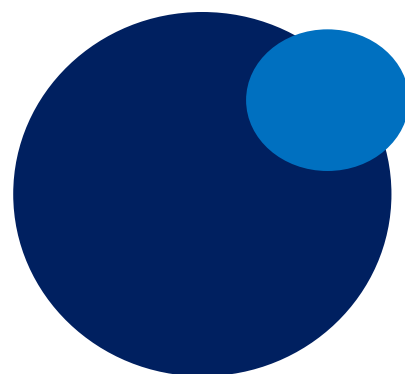
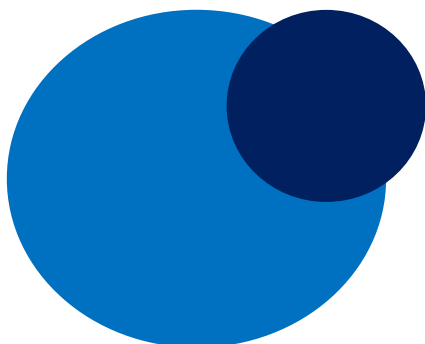
WELCOME TO OUR PRIMARY SCHOOL

We are a small village Church of England Primary School for children aged between 4 and 11. We are located in Swannington, North West Leicestershire and we are a proud member of the RISE Trust. We offer a warm welcome, in a distinctively Christian environment.

Our school has a newly built building behind the original Victorian building, which is overlooked by beautiful nature and our forest school grounds. This building is where you will find our Reception, Year One and Year Two children. The Reception class have their own outdoor area that the children can access throughout the day, opening up further learning opportunities.

STARTING SCHOOL

Our school's newly built building has a classroom downstairs for Foundation Stage and admits children on a full-time basis at the beginning of the school year in which they are five. All pupils are expected to attend school on a full time basis after an initial induction period, during which parents and children are encouraged to visit school together to become familiar with the surroundings and get to know their teacher.

All children within the school catchment area are eligible for admission provided that an application is made to the Local Authority (LA) via their website (details below). Children both inside and outside our catchment area can apply for a school space.

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD

INCLUSION

As a school we strongly oppose racism and discrimination in any form. We promote equal opportunity for all, and our policies are inclusive to ensure we all work together to promote a deep understanding of the rich diversity of cultures in today's society. We carry out an accessibility audit each year, and are confident we can meet the diverse physical and educational needs of our pupils. No pupil will be declined admission on the basis of disability. We work with a range of outside agencies to ensure the needs of disabled pupils are fully met, and this is reviewed annually in consultation with parents. Please inform us if you or your child has a disability which may make access to any part of the school or curriculum difficult, so we can ensure all reasonable adjustments are made

SPECIAL EDUCATION NEEDS AND DISABILITY (SEND)

The Governors and staff work hard to ensure that children with SEND have access to a fully inclusive curriculum, and can take part in everyday activities. We will always consult parents if we feel that a child needs special support with learning and parents are encouraged and helped to express their views. All staff work towards supporting these children effectively and boosting their self-esteem.

SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN

Children with SEND will receive specific help from their class teachers, the SEND co-ordinator and learning support assistants. Where necessary, the school and parents will consult with and receive advice from various outside agencies. The progress for children with SEND is assessed and reviewed, and individual or group education plans are produced accordingly. We have a mental health lead who supports children with a range of things such as anxiety, bereavement in the family, low self-esteem etc. Children are put forward for sessions by their class teacher, after consultation with parents.

PASTORAL CARE

Effective pastoral care depends on mutual respect, confidence and understanding between home and the school. We aim to motivate children through praise and reward for good behaviour, but have a clear behaviour policy, which we follow for children who make the wrong choices if necessary. If your child's behaviour is causing concern at school, you will be informed and invited to discuss the way forward with the class teacher.



PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

We strongly encourage parents and carers to be involved in our school in a variety of ways. One of the ways we do this is by inviting parents to come and look around their child's classroom on open evenings to allow the children the opportunity to showcase their learning.

Twice a year parents are invited to attend an appointment with class teachers to discuss their child's progress and attainment, as well as staff being available at the end of each day. Further opportunities are available to parents should they want to become more involved. We have an active PTA (called FOSS: Friends of Swannington School) who are always looking for more support or you may wish to become a Governor at the school. FOSS help us to arrange days such as the school disco, the summer fayre, visits from Santa and lots more!

If you ever need to speak to your child's teacher, the best time to do this is either at the beginning or end of the day when you meet your child outside of their classroom. You can also message your child's class teacher via Dojo or ring/email the office during the day.



SCHOOL INFORMATION AND SERVICES

Early birds before school club

Early birds is our before school club that starts from 7:30am until school starts. The children have their breakfast included at early birds, and then play lots of games and do fun activities.

After-school care

We have an after-school club which is ran by a local childminder on our school grounds until 5:30pm. The after-school club is called Lil-Stars Childcare and more information can be found on our website.

Collective worship

Collective Worship is an important part of everyday life at Swannington school. We enjoy getting together, listening to stories, discussing events and singing. Children can play an active part in our worship by lighting the candle, choosing the songs and joining in with prayers.



FOOD AND DRINK

Pupils in EYFS, Year 1 and year 2 are offered free fresh fruit daily. For KS2, we promote healthy eating and ask that children bring a healthy snack to have during their morning break.

We ask that each child brings a water bottle to school and they will be able to re-fill this during the day should they need to.

We are a “no nuts” school, and kindly ask that nuts are not brought into school. Please check packaging before bringing food into school.

Milk is available to all pupils via the Cool Milk Scheme. This is free for all under-fives and subsidised for pupils aged five and over. If you would like your child to have milk, please register at www/coolmilk.com/register.

At lunchtimes children eat either a packed lunch or a hot meal in the school hall. All hot meals are cooked daily by our catering partner Relish and children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free dinners.
